**Mosaic Community Services** - Provides emergency assistance to low-income individuals with mental health issues.

**PACT: Helping Children with Special Needs** - Supports medical child care for children younger than five.

**Prologue** - Helps homeless families return to stable, permanent housing.

**L.O.U.D. (Life Outreach and Urban Development)** - Support of staff training and equipment for food pantry.

**Maryland Coalition Against Sexual Assault** - Provides legal services to victims of child sex abuse.

**Moveable Feast** - Provides nutritious food for home-bound clients.

**Service Coordination, Inc.** - Provides client financial assistance funds.

**The Episcopal Housing Corporation** - Provides client eviction prevention funds.

**TurnAround** - Purchases new security systems in transitional housing.

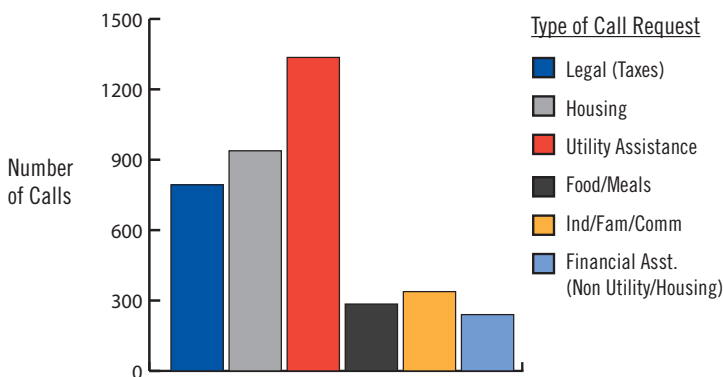
