This allows our Community Partnership Board of Carroll County to help “fill in the gaps” and ensure every donor dollar does the most good. Local needs. Local expertise. Local decisions. CHARTER MEMBERS:

American Cancer Society - Provides no-cost transportation to medical appointments for cancer patients.

American Red Cross of Central Maryland - Supports 80 percent of disaster relief efforts and emergency services.

American Heart Association - Supports awareness education for heart disease and stroke prevention.

Community Health Charities - Supports the work of a federation of member health organizations assisting people with health and disability-related issues.

IMPACT PARTNERS:

Impact partners receive grant funding through a competitive funding process.

Carroll Child Care Center - Provides tuition subsidies for low-income families.

Human Services Programs of Carroll County - Provides comprehensive services to individuals facing homelessness, domestic violence victims in imminent danger, and people in permanent supportive housing.

Mission of Mercy - Provides patient care through the Mission of Mercy Mobile Clinic program.

Mosaic Community Services - Helps low-income individuals with severe mental illness purchase medication.

COMMUNITY RESPONSE GRANTEES:

Community response grants provide up to \$7,500 quarterly for programmatic and immediate needs.

Boys & Girls Club of Westminster - Supports the Summer Enrichment program.

Bridges: The Union Bridge Youth Committee - Supports program supplies for youth enrichment activities.

Carroll Child Care Center - Supports child care scholarships.

COMMUNITY RESPONSE GRANTEES (continued):

Family and Children's Services of Central Maryland - Provides care for physically challenged and mentally impaired adults during the day through the West End Place Medical Adult Day Care.

Human Services Programs of Carroll County - Provides supportive services to those in the Emergency Assistance/Family Links program.

The Arc of Carroll County - Covers transportation to and from jobs for persons with disabilities.

The Salvation Army, Greater Baltimore Area Command - Supports client energy assistance and eviction prevention at the Carroll County Family Service Center.

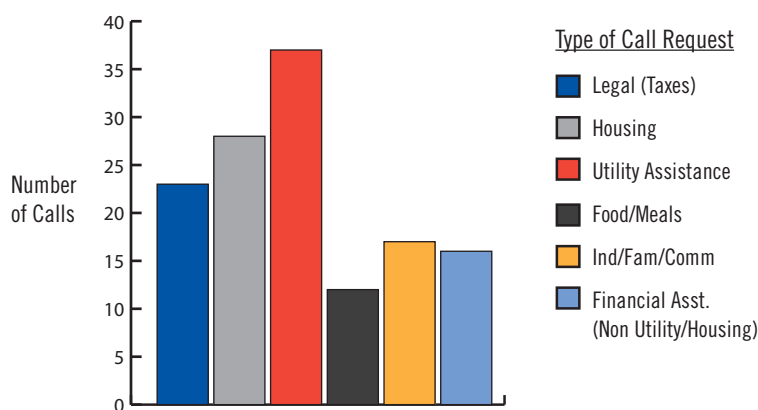
