CHARTER MEMBERS:

American Cancer Society - Provides no-cost transportation to medical appointments for cancer patients.

American Red Cross of Central Maryland - Supports 80 percent of disaster relief efforts and emergency services.

American Heart Association - Supports awareness education for heart disease and stroke prevention.

Catholic Charities of Baltimore - Supports individuals and families with meals, shelter, and critical basic need services.

IMPACT PARTNERS:

Impact partners receive grant funding through a competitive funding process.

Boys and Girls Clubs of Harford County - Promotes academic improvement and proficiency for youth in the Project Learn After-School Education Enhancement program.

Harford Family House - Provides emergency shelter and case management services.

Inner County Outreach - Helps prevent homelessness among low-income families.

Mason-Dixon Community Services - Provides intensive case management and financial support.

The Arc Northern Chesapeake Region - Provides family support for people with developmental disabilities.

The Sexual Assault/Spouse Abuse Resource Center (SARC) - Supports a 24-hour emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence, sexual violence and stalking.

COMMUNITY RESPONSE GRANTEES:

Community response grants provide up to \$7,500 quarterly for programmatic and immediate needs.

Harford Community Action Agency - Supports emergency rent assistance for adult-only households.

Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna - Supports emergency repairs to homes.

Inner County Outreach - Provides energy assistance and eviction prevention funds.

Mason-Dixon Community Services - Provides emergency energy assistance funds.

Moveable Feast - Provides food for meal delivery.

Tabitha's House - Purchases food, cleaning supplies and toiletries for clients.

The Sexual Assault/Spouse Abuse Resource Center (SARC) - Supported the replacement of a commercial stove in the emergency shelter.

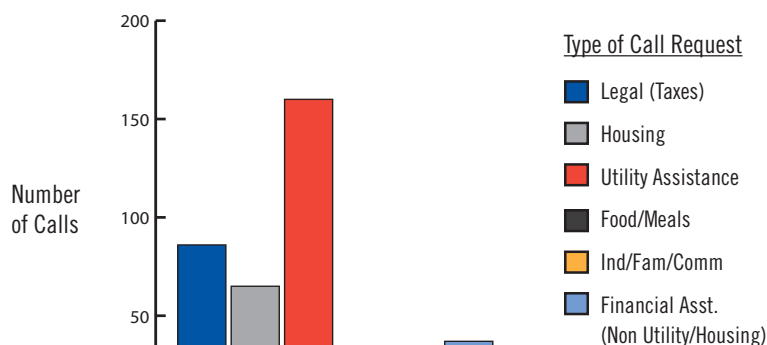
